

### Indigenous Engagement and Resources

We gather for this annual meeting of the Rural Sociological Society in Madison, Wisconsin, which is situated on land that has been stewarded by Indigenous peoples since time immemorial. Indigenous people, particularly the Hoocąk (Ho-Chunk) people, have a historical and enduring relationship to this place, which they call Teejop (day-JOPE, or Four Lakes). Colonialism is a current and ongoing process that has harmed Indigenous peoples, and we aim to raise awareness of the Indigenous people whose territory we gather on, and to provide suggestions for ways we can learn more, show gratitude, and connect.



We believe that the RSS has the responsibility to engage with Indigenous peoples. At the individual level this can include learning more about and supporting Hoocak culture and history, and the 12 First Nations of Wisconsin. Some tools you can use to do this include:




### Hotel Map - Lobby Level






### Hotel Map - 2nd Floor





### Hotel Map - 6th Floor


