

Land Statement for the 85th Annual Meeting of the Rural Sociological Society University of Vermont, Burlington, VT, 2023

Land Statement – RSS Meeting 2023

We gather for this, the 85th annual meeting of the Rural Sociological Society (RSS) on the campus of the University of Vermont, which is situated on land that has been stewarded by Indigenous peoples since time immemorial. Indigenous people, particularly the Western Abenaki, have a historical and enduring relationship with this land, forest, and waters, including as a place to exchange, sustain and gather.

Colonialism is a current and ongoing process that has harmed Indigenous peoples. As a professional association focused on research and education, we aim to raise awareness of the Indigenous people whose territory we gather on, and to provide ideas for ways we can learn more, show gratitude, and connect.

Calls to Action – Individuals

Land statements are one step towards increasing awareness of and honoring Indigenous peoples and their relationship to the land and traditional territories upon which we work and gather as an organization. In addition to this statement, we should be engaging as individuals and as an organization to learn from, work with, support and listen to Indigenous peoples. At the individual level, this can include learning more about Abenaki culture and history. Some tools you can use as a starting point include:

Calls to Action – Organizational

As an organization, we should be engaging in critical reflection and dialogue about the history of our organization and the institutions which we are connected to, including how they have benefitted from the dispossession and displacement of Indigenous peoples throughout the United States. We can also help to develop relationships and collaborate to address the interests of Indigenous scholars and tribal colleges, including the importance of pursuing more equitable resources. We ask that the Rural Sociological Society continue these dialogues and develop relationships with kindred groups to advance professional and institutional development opportunities.


Campus Map – University of Vermont













Building Maps – Aiken Floor 1
